LOS ANGELES, USA: March 30, 2018 – Italy have become the team to beat in the Mixed Relay after securing back-to-back victories with their gold medal at UIPM 2018 Pentathlon World Cup Los Angeles today.

Alessandra Frezza and Riccardo de Luca repeated the success enjoyed by Gloria Tocchi and Gianluca Micozzi at Pentathlon World Cup Cairo as Italy held off a strong challenge from USA and Mexico to secure victory on a hot day in Pomona, Los Angeles County.

It was a satisfying day for Isabella Isaksen and Amro Elgeziry as the husband-and-wife team were competing in unison for USA for the first time and made it on to the podium with an impressive silver medal.
